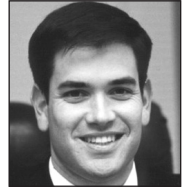
# MEET A FEW OF THE WINNERS BACKED BY NCCF

## U.S. SENATE



**RAND PAUL (KY).** An ophthalmologist and self-described “Constitutional conservative,” Paul is the founder of Kentucky Taxpayers United. His father is Rep. Ron Paul (R-TX). Paul defeated the Republican “establishment” candidate in the primary to capture the nomination for the seat being vacated by Sen. Jim Bunning. Though relentlessly attacked by the liberal news media, Paul went on to win a convincing victory by 12 percentage points over Atty. Gen. Jack Conway (D).

**MARCO RUBIO (FL).** Written off by the pundits and party insiders, Rubio was given almost no chance in the GOP primary against Gov. Charlie Crist. But Rubio stormed back from 30 points down in the polls to take the lead, prompting Crist to drop out of the primary race. Rubio bested him again when Crist ran as an independent in the general election. Rubio cruised to victory with 49% of the vote; Crist and the Democrat candidate split the rest.



**PAT TOOMEY (PA).** Former Congressman Toomey defeated ultra-liberal Congressman Joe Sestak to take the seat of Arlen Specter, beaten by Sestak in the Democratic primary. Toomey is a solid conservative who’ll stand up for principle. In other words, he’s everything Specter was not.

## U.S. HOUSE

**LOU BARLETTA (PA).** On his third try, Hazleton Mayor Lou Barletta finally ended the 25-year Congressional career of irritable Democrat Paul Kanjorski. Barletta made national news as Mayor for getting tough anti-illegal immigration ordinances enacted in Hazleton.



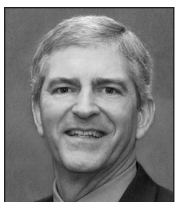
**CHIP CRAVAACK (MN).** Navy veteran and commercial pilot Cravaack played giant-killer as he ousted liberal Rep. Jim Oberstar, who had been in Congress 36 years. Cravaack will be the first Republican to represent the Duluth-area district since 1947.

**STEPHEN FINCHER (TN).** The charismatic Fincher is a seventh-generation farmer and member of The Fincher Family, a gospel-singing ensemble. A political novice, he defeated a better-funded establishment GOP politician in the primary and easily won the seat being vacated by 11-term Democrat John Tanner.



**FRANK GUINTA (NH).** Guinta was the tax-cutting, budget-reducing Mayor of heavily Democratic Manchester before winning the GOP primary to take on far-left Rep. Carol Shea-Porter. He cruised to an 11-point victory on Election Day.

**KRISTI NOEM (SD).** A state legislator, farmer, rancher, wife, and mother, Noem ousted Rep. Stephanie Herseth Sandlin to capture South Dakota’s lone House seat. She’s already made an impact in Washington by being elected the GOP freshman class representative to the House leadership.



**DANIEL WEBSTER (FL).** A veteran state legislator, Webster emerged from a crowded GOP primary to go on to crush freshman Rep. Alan Grayson in the general election. Grayson was widely known for his arrogance and outrageous attacks on Republicans. His attempts to tar Webster as “Taliban Dan” backfired badly as he managed to garner only 38% of the vote.
